



Who Are We?

The Cathedral Clinic aims to provide general practice medical services to migrant adults and children who have difficulty accessing medical care, including individuals with low / no income, and those who are without or are ineligible for a medical card. The clinic is staffed by two qualified doctors in their final year of General Practice Specialist Training. The clinic is overseen by Dr Austin O'Carroll (NDCGP & Safetynet).

The clinic forms part of the Safetynet Service and is run in conjunction with the North Dublin City GP Training Programme (NDCGP).
